Naturalíst's Notes

For twenty years we have always started the year off playing catch-up with fingers crossed. Thanks to many donations at the end of last year and grants from United Way, Memorial Lutheran Church in Nevada, and Story County Community Foundation, we were able to start 2022 off WITH funds. It made for a much more enjoyable year. We took the after-school kids on trips and did little projects without worrying about whether we could afford it. We were able to offer some trips for affordable prices again. We paid the bands at our annual Fresh Air Concert fundraiser a little closer to what they deserve. It was nice. I have all of you to thank for that!

After over a year of very little activity, it was a very busy year again. Thank goodness! We started seeing some schools coming back for field trips. We've stayed busy with our faithful Homeschool Association and have added a few others. Thanks to Jacobus, Savanna, and Kaleb, we started working with Ellsworth Community College's Conservation students at the site. They have done everything from helping teach programs to burning and working on our prairie to being extra hands during our annual celebrations for the public. It has been great to have extra help and see them grow into future conservation colleagues!

Summer flew by once again. We started with Overnight Camp in early June. I love this camp, because some of the kids are so excited that they are finally old enough to stay a night in the barn! They also get to meet kids from all over central Iowa, canoe the Skunk River, and work on their Special Places out in the woods. Then, we were off to Minnesota with another great group of kids. We saw sinkholes, Lake Superior, waterfalls, drawbridges, amazing geological spots, wolves and their babies, lighthouses, the sites of downtown Minneapolis (which is not like downtown New Providence), played minigolf, enjoyed Mall of America, had fantastic food, and found nature in the middle of the Twin Cities. Daycamp Time! First came Building Camp, where we built 2 picnic tables, benches, and a new garden shed out of pallets. Thanks to Alan and Rylan, our high-school campers, it was well-built and the younger campers had a couple really great guys to look up to. The rest of the summer was filled with stomping in the creek, getting muddy, learning archery, canoeing, singing, campfires, working on our Survival forts, making new friends, and a lot of crafts and glitter. We wrapped up the summer with our high school+ trip to the East Coast. I just love this group. I know they have to grow up and eventually can't do our trips, but "I Don't WANNA!" I want them to join me every year. Man, have they had to expand their minds in the last 6 years and have graciously put up with a lot of stuff outside the itinerary. Nothing could top the RV trip from hell, but this year's trip was kind of a nightmare traveling by train. We started our adventure sitting and waiting 4 hours in Osceola and then missed our connecting train in Chicago, so we got to enjoy a night in Chicago on Amtrak's bill. I loved it, but my non-city slickers wanted to get going. It was just as bad coming back home. The trip itself was incredible: Ocean, mountains, our own little house, a ferry ride where we saw dolphins, a night on the Boardwalk, Duck Donuts, weird animals, Washington D.C. and sites where the history of our country were lived. While we were in D.C. we got to watch Marine One come in for a landing and the Chicago and San Diego Honor Flight veterans arrived just as we were at the WWII Memorial. We were able to raise over \$2000 while paying a little more for the acts and putting a little more into the stage and sound equipment which can be used not only for concerts, but other productions, weddings, etc. It was so much fun and I was blown away with the talent this year! We had many of our favorites back and were joined by DK Imamu Akachi and friends from Des Moines and the 2021 Iowa Blues Challenge Winners, Buckmiller/Schwager Band. It was an incredible day of music played for a very small crowd, which was disappointing. After a day of feeling upset that so few came to support us and these talented people, I thought of the few people who were there. The ones who had a lot going on too, but fit us in, and had a blast, and thanked us. I thought of all the people who helped and gave of their time and talents and equipment because they believe in us. I thought of the people who sent notes and donations because they knew they wouldn't be able to make it, and our wonderful sponsors who really came through for us this year, allowing us to expand. Those are the people who matter. I decided to go the route that maybe people really did want to come but were actually just too busy. We started wondering if maybe we should try a series of concerts throughout the summer, so that will be our plan for 2023. We will start the summer off with an all-day bash and hold evening concerts at the end of each month until Labor Day. We'll see if it works. My hope is that people enjoy all of our acts all summer long.

This fall, we had another successful Fall Festival. Around 200 people enjoyed hayrack rides, hikes, apple baseball and games, the prairie maze, face paintings, and crafts on a gorgeous October Day. A few joined us for a meal afterwards. One adorable little girl and her daddy enjoyed the movie with me that evening. The next weekend was one of the most beautiful weddings I've ever been to at TLC. I'm a little partial, of course, since it was our oldest Cameron and his sweet Caitlyn.
